

# IDENTITY PARADE

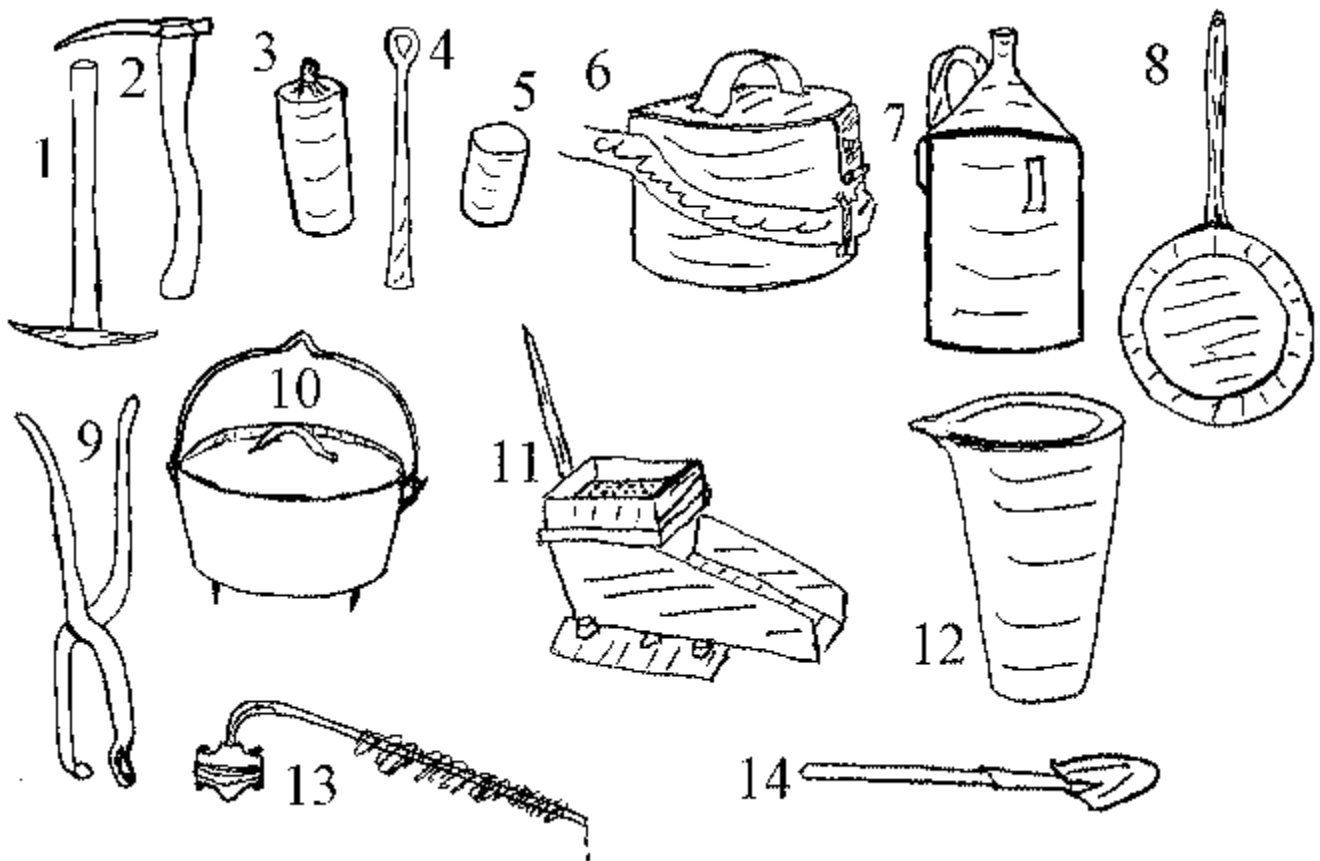
History Hill holds the ultimate collection of 1800s gold rush relics. We may never know exactly what happened, but we do know what tools the diggers left behind.

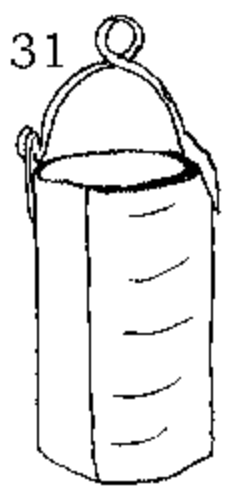
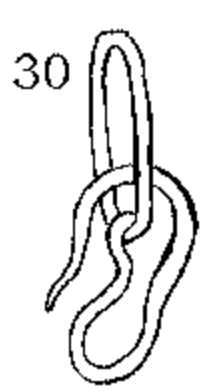
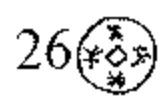
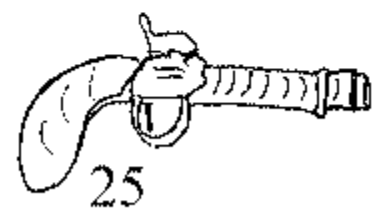
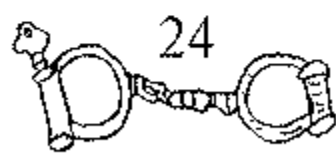
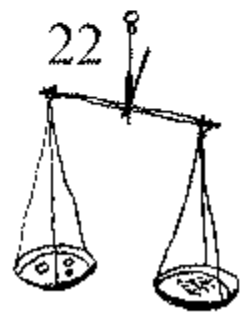
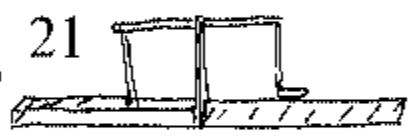
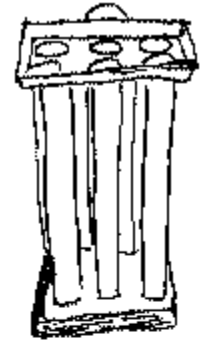
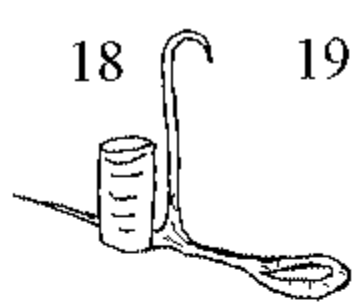
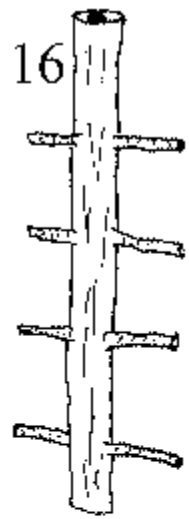
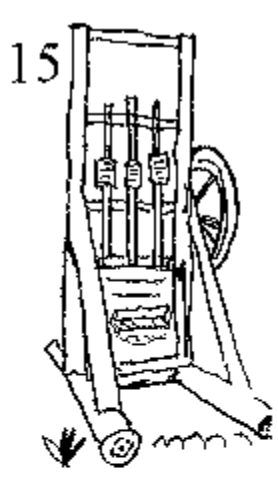
\*Gold is money. Money for the taking. Gold was worth what it weighed, be it by Chinese or Europeans.
